Maria's Story

"I'm a 35 year old single woman who has been through tremendous ups and downs with relationships, including being in couple of verbal and physically abusive long term relationships. It took me as much as 6 years to bring myself [to] opening up and talk about what happened to me with anyone besides the police. I thought with time I'll be able to forget and put the past behind me. What I didn't realize that how much I'm hurting myself keeping and holding things inside me.

One day I got tired of being depressed and I felt like if I don't talk to someone I will damage my life and a life time of happiness for myself. I started seeing a counsellor, Michael, who has changed my life and brought me back to my old happy life before those abusive relationships I had.

With his professional experience in VAW (Violence Against Women) program and with his wonderful and helpful advices, I have managed to feel so differently about myself and my life.

I am so grateful for his help and his recommendation for the "New Beginnings" group which helped me a lot. The group and the counsellors in that program also helped me a great deal and I thank them for that.

With Michael's help I have found myself, my path and I found great friends in the "New Beginnings Program for Women". I know many people seek help but what I believe is that talking to a "right counsellor" who will guide you in the "right path" is very important. My family who knows from the beginning that I seek professional help regarding what I went through, also thank Michael for making a big change in me being a woman who in the past

always had tears in my eyes which now smiling a lot, feeling happy and trusting myself to make a right choice for my future. Thank You Michael!"



Highlights: "Responding to Community"

Family Services of Peel (FSP) has been making a concerted effort to make its services more accessible to the residents of Peel. Recognizing that transportation can be a considerable barrier to accessing supports, we have moved more services into the community.

Several partnerships have been forged, which facilitate this direction. FSP staff are now located offsite at The Knights Table, Our Place Peel, Peel Senior Link, Regeneration Outreach, and University of Toronto-Mississauga Campus. These partnerships serve to expand our services to the broader

community.

Staff person, Mohamed Bhabha and his team of ten volunteers are vigorously working together to lay the foundation for the soon-to-be successful "Neighbour-to-Neighbour" program, funded through New Horizons. This program consists of a new initiative aimed at helping seniors who are of Muslim faith lead more active lives and to help them participate in their community. Seniors are being encouraged to contribute their skills, experience and wisdom and this involvement will help to reduce the risk of social isolation in their community.

This is just one of many new and creative ideas that we have developed in order to offer our services to Peel residents.

The University of Toronto Mississauga campus (UTM) has been our most recent step to the expansion of Family Services of Peel. As of September 2008, Family Services of Peel has been directly linked to the UTM. We are currently running our services out of an office within their facility.

Family Services of Peel and the University of Toronto— Mississauga Campus offer students a wide variety of counselling, such as school related stress or interpersonal issues, family problems, grief and much more.

Family Services of Peel, in collaboration with Catholic Family Services of Peel-Dufferin, received a three-year funding grant from The Ontario Trillium Foundation to develop a community-wide support system for men who were abused during childhood. This represents a major collaborative initiative by approximately twenty agencies in the Region of Peel. A Word from the Executive Director

One of Family Services of Peel's strategic directions relates to increasing our responsiveness to the community. The majority of the agency's services are offered out of its two offices and satellite locations. In reviewing how we could make services more accessible, it was determined that through partnerships, we could locate more services in the community. The partnerships would also enable Peel residents to have access to a broader spectrum of supports.

I am very pleased to report on four new partnerships that successfully meet these goals. **Thomas L. Kennedy Secondary School** – Family Services of Peel is providing parenting workshops for families in this school's community. These workshops are free and are held in the school, making the service accessible for parents of students who attend the high school.

Our Place Peel provides short-term shelter accommodations for street-involved youth. Recognizing that youth accessing these services can benefit from counselling support, Family Services of Peel now provides onsite counselling at the shelter.

The Knights Table provides meals and food services to those in need and those affected by poverty in Peel Region. Our partnership with Knights Table enables us to have a staff person onsite who can connect clients with appropriate community resources.

Discussions with the **University of Toronto—Mississauga Campus** (**UTM**) identified the need for onsite counselling and family life education workshops. As a result, Family Services of Peel has located a staff person at UTM to provide counselling support to students. We are currently in the process of understanding the needs of students with respect to workshops that will enable them to better cope with life challenges.



Valuing Volunteers

The population of volunteers at Family Services of Peel (FSP) has boomed. We are proud and honored to be well known in the community, Peel Region and throughout the Greater Toronto Area. The support we have received from secondary and post-secondary institutions has been overwhelming and we currently have five post-secondary students working at the agency. Three are from York University, both Sameen Farrukh and Sarah Wright are enrolled as BSWs and Amanda Hignell is enrolled as an MSW. We also have two Sheridan College students both enrolled in their last year of the SSW program, Michael Chip Johnson and Maddy Scrbic. Our students offer FSP a wide variety of skills, knowledge and diversity.

Maddy was born in Mississauga in June 1989 and is of a Slovenian background, although her father was born in Toronto and mother born in France. Her father is a successful graphic arts business owner while her mother works for the University of Toronto—Mississauga Campus as a landscape technician. Maddy attended St. Francis Xavier high school where in grade 12, she decided to pursue some form of social studies. Being the person that she is, Maddy did not want to limit herself and decided to pursue social service work in an effort to work with a larger demographic. After Maddy receives her SSW diploma, she will pursue a future in Human Resources. Maddy describes FSP as a, "Comfortable, friendly environment that works well as a team. There are no bosses here, only friends."

We, at Family Services of Peel, certainly value Maddy's versatility and eagerness to assist others. She's a sweet and caring person and we're delighted to have her as part of our team.
