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	Sandra emphasized the importance of connecting with organizations, such as Rising

	research within the community. Susan suggested approaching service providers to provide		
	demographic data.		
	4. Interview Population		
	An in-depth interview with survivors will be conducted. This will be achieved by working		
	with Katarina to interview three to five women and produce a full report by the end of the		
	year. The objective is to maintain a client-centered approach where Human Trafficking		
	survivors have voice in the report of service effectiveness.
